


## THE LIFE AND TIMES OF GEORGE FERNANDES




## SHUNYA





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


## BHAGAT SINGH

## JEZEBEL



K.S. Bijukumar works with the U.S. Consulate General Chennai. This is their first joint translation.




#### THESE ERRORS ARE CORRECT

A meditation on grief, *These Errors Are Correct*, with illustrations by the author, is Jeet Thayil's most intimate work to date. In poems of tenderness and rage, time blurs into a continuous present visited by Billy the Kid, the Buddha, Lata Mangeshkar, Jesus and Beethoven, by unnamed protagonists for whom faith and addiction are interchangeable, and by a remote god-like figure who will 'lick / your wound with his infected tongue'. A range of fixed and invented forms—rhymed syllabics, terza rima, ghazals, sonnets, the sestina, the canzone, stealth rhymes—make for a virtuosic, haunting collection.

#### ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Jeet Thayil was born into a Syrian Christian family in Kerala. He worked as a journalist for twenty-one years, in Bombay, Bangalore, Hong Kong and New York City. The first instalment of his Bombay Trilogy, *Narcopolis*, was shortlisted for the Booker Prize and became an unlikely bestseller. His book of poems *These Errors Are Correct* won the Sahitya Akademi Award (India's National Academy of Letters).




## WHERE THE COBBLED PATH LEADS




## NEHRU AND THE SPIRIT OF INDIA




## **BURNING BRIGHT**

Ten innocent people were mowed down by security forces in Malom, a village near Imphal, in November 2000. The perpetrators were not punished; they were protected under the Armed Forces Special Powers Act which empowers military and para-military personnel to arrest, shoot, even kill, anyone on the grounds of mere suspicion. In response to this, Sharmila, a young Manipuri, began an indefinite hunger strike. The government arrested her and force-fed her through nasal tubes. She was released and re-arrested innumerable times, but she stood by her demand. *Burning Bright* is a hard-hitting account of a people caught between the crossfire of militants and security forces and is a moving portrait of 'the Iron Lady of Manipur'.


## LILAVATI

Lilavati, written in 1905, remains unparalleled as the only biography of a daughter written by her father. Lilavati was tutored at home and raised to be a learned and discerning girl, and Govardhanram inculcated values in her that he believed should be imbibed by all. Lilavati took these values to heart, and died uncared-for at the age of twenty-one of tuberculosis. Govardhanram wrote this book after Lilavati's death, in an attempt to alleviate his bereavement and to try to find justification for his beliefs. The book shows how women were being moulded during the rising nationalist movement. Despite Govardhanram's attempts to contain Lilavati as a unidimensional figure of his imagination, she goes beyond that, sometimes by questioning the fundamental tenets of Brahminical beliefs.

## ABOUT THE AUTHORS

Govardhanram Tripathi was a towering figure in Gujarati literature and wrote the *Saraswatichandra* series of novels.

Tridip Suhrud is a widely acclaimed Gandhi scholar and translator of the four-part Saraswatichandra.




#### THE LAST WHITE MAN








## THE NEWLYWEDS




## THE BELLBOY



## TEMPLE LAMP



While we quote liberally from his Urdu poetry, we know little on his writings in Persian, and while we read of his love for the city of Delhi, we find in Temple Lamp his appreciation and rapture over the Hindu city of Benares. Translated into English for the first time as a poem both intellectually and culturally significant, it is verse written by a Muslim poet, writing in Persian, praising a Hindu town.

#### ABOUT THE AUTHORS

Mirza Ghalib (1797–1869) is popular as the greatest Urdu poet, most well-known for his ghazals. He wrote more poetry in Persian than in Urdu. Ghalib lived during the reign of the last Mughal king, whose court was the centre of the golden age of the Urdu poetry of Delhi. He wrote in other poetic forms such as the qasidā, qatā, and the masnavi.

Maaz Bin Bilal (b. 1986) is a poet, a translator, and an academic. Maaz was the recipient of the Charles Wallace Trust Fellowship in Writing and Translation in Wales (2018–19) and has also just received the Akademie Schloss Solitude fellowship in writing (2022).




## SOJOURN




## NIGHTS OF PLAGUE






## THE ESSENTIALS OF HINDUISM




## RANIS & THE RAJ


## THE PEPLE OF INDIA


#### THE MONKEY'S WOUND AND OTHER STORIES

## ABOUT THE AUTHORS

Hajra Masroor (1930-2012) is remembered as one of the most celebrated Pakistani writers of Urdu short stories and narrative fiction. Deeply influenced by the Progressive Writers' Movement, she made a place for herself among writers like Ismat Chughtai, Saadat Hasan Manto, Krishan Chander, and Rajinder Singh Bedi. Masroor wrote with great energy and wit. Her stories possess an elegant prose style, strong female characterization, and a little twist at the end that keeps her readers baffled and engaged.

## SELECTED SHORT STORIES

Rajinder Singh Bedi: Selected Short Stories curates some of the best work by the Urdu writer. Written between 1940 and 1975, the fifteen short stories in this collection include favorites like Garam Coat (Woollen Coat); Lajwanti; Apne Dukh Mujhe De Do (Give Me Your Sorrows); Jogia; Kokh Jali (The Barren One); Quarantine; Rahman ke Joote (Rahman's Shoes) and many others. Bedi's stories dissect human emotions with grim precision. Deeply affected by the Partition, his stories make several allusions to the emotional and psychological impact of separation.

## ABOUT THE AUTHORS

Rajinder Singh Bedi (1915- 1984) lived many lives: as a student and postmaster in Lahore, a venerated screenwriter for popular Hindi films in Bombay; and a winner of both the Sahitya Akademi award as well as the Filmfare awards. Considered one of the leading progressive writers of modern Urdu fiction, Bedi was one of the most prominent architects of modern Urdu writing along with such leading lights as Munshi Prem Chand, Krishan Chander, and Sadat Hasan Manto.

Gopi Chand Narang is highly regarded as an Urdu critic and theorist. He was conferred with the Padma Shri and Padma Bhushan awards by the Government of India.

Surinder Deol has authored Sahir: A Literary Portrait, Endless Life, and a book of poems called A Moment in the Universe. He has also translated the Divan-e Ghalib.
