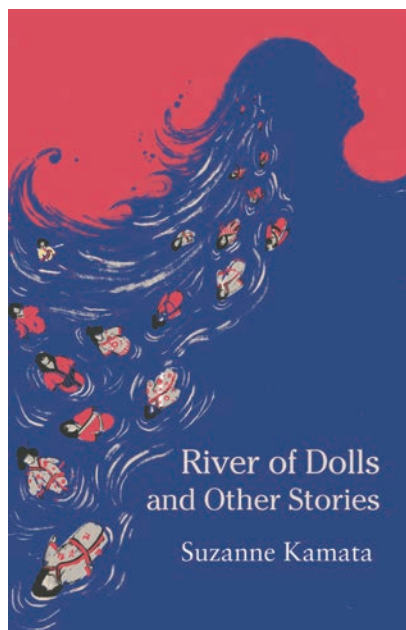
River of Dolls and Other Stories

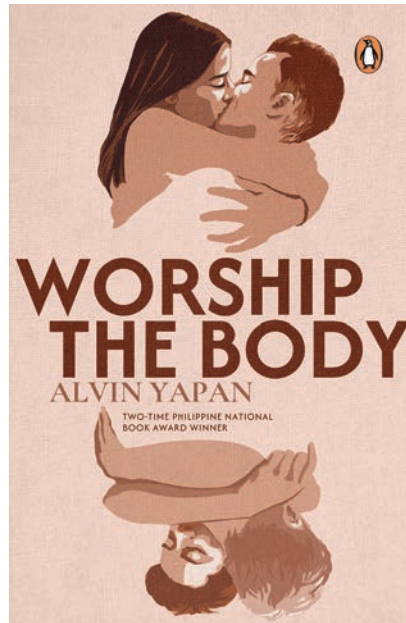
Worship the Body

Four individuals try to conceive an extraordinary family in urban Manila and rediscover that secrets can also be joyous

Jaime drops by a restaurant to cool off with a glass of beer. Jun waits on him during that random visit. Something happens between them when their eyes meet over the glass of beer—Jaime considers it an accident and Jun considers it luck. Years later, their paths cross again when Jamie’s wife, Ria, innocently hires Jun as their family driver and is introduced to Jun’s wife, Maya.

Ria and Maya establish a unique connection as women confronted with questions about power and emotions even as they uncover the bond between their husbands. Jaime and Jun are confronted with questions about history and myth.

Told from different but interlocking points of view, the story of Jamie, Jun, Ria, and Maya becomes a song, complete with recurring refrains and a coda, intimating that there are silences to the body that are essential to our understanding of happiness.



Alvin Yapan

Alvin Yapan is an author and a film-maker. He is a fellow at the 2022 Writers Immersion and Cultural Exchange of Sing Lit Station and Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology University. His works, both in fiction and film, delve into the uncanny aspects of contemporary encounters with the non- and post-human. His first novel in the vernacular, *Ang Sandaling mga Mata* (*This Moment of Eyes*, 2006), and his collection of short stories, *Sangkatauhan Sangkahayupan* (*Humanity Bestiary*, 2017), both received the Philippine National Book Award.

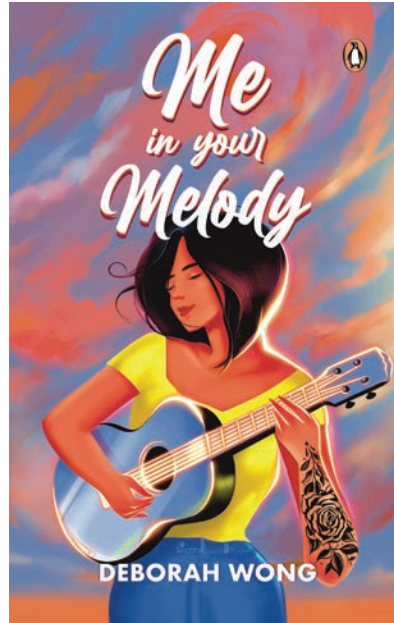
Me in Your Melody

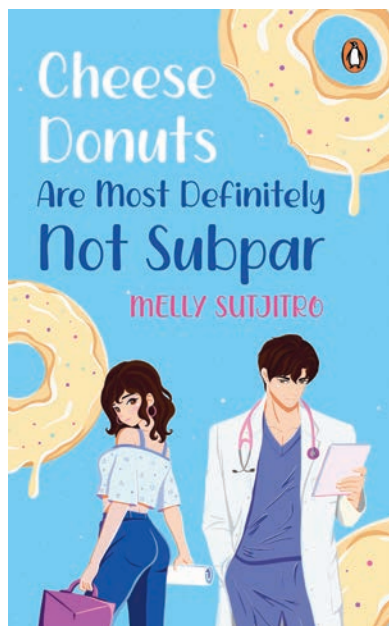
Cheese Donuts Are Most Definitely Not Subpar

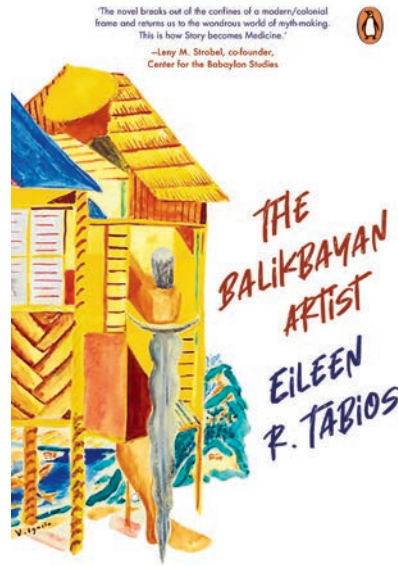
The Balikbayan Artist

A tale of the artist's role in troubled times set amid a dictatorship

Farm-laborer-turned-artist Vance Igorta returns to the Philippines as a balikbayan after nearly fifty years in the United States. He is a member of the Manong Generation, the largest diaspora of Filipinos who worked physically demanding jobs, mostly in California's agricultural fields.

The Balikbayan Artist—inspired by and dedicated to Venancio C. Igorta (1912–2000), the real-life leading artist of the Manong Generation—takes readers from the early twentieth century to the present day when Vance Igorta's art is being discovered anew.

Igorta's legacy is validated for allowing his art to address the tensions of his time instead of keeping it solely entrenched in aesthetic concerns. The artist's choice reflects what he learned as a voraciously self-educated person: that in circumstances where power corrupts, what makes anyone and everyone dangerous is love.



Eileen R. Tabios

Eileen R. Tabios has released over seventy collections of poetry, fiction, art, essays, and experimental writings from publishers around the world. Translated into thirteen languages, she has also edited, co-edited, or conceptualized fifteen anthologies, which has involved hundreds of other poets and writers.

Recent releases include an autobiography, *The Inventor*; a poetry collection, *Because I Love You, I Become War*; an art monograph, *Drawing the Six Directions*; a novel, *DoveLion: A Fairy Tale for Our Times* (with a Filipino translation, *KalapatingLeon*, by Danton Remoto).

Her body of work further includes a first poetry book, *Beyond Life Sentences*, which received the Philippines' National Book Award for Poetry, as well as invention of the hay(na)ku, a twenty-first century diasporic poetic form and the monobon poetry form based on the monostich. This collection offers a selection of short stories by Fatimah Busu, one of the foremost Malay women writers of the past century. A master of the short story form, Fatimah Busu's writing is known for her bold subject matter, fresh approach to language, and idiosyncratic style. Her short stories offer an acute portrayal of the inner contradictions of Malay society, particularly the realities of women in rural Malaysia grappling with the forces of tradition and modernity. Many of Fatimah Busu's stories are set in her hometown of Kampung Pasir Pekan, Kelantan and are imbued with the colourful peculiarities of Kelantanese dialect, sensibility, and everyday life.

Fatimah Busu's evocative fiction blurs the boundaries of social realism, dreamscapes, reimagined mythology, and magic realism. Most of the stories gathered here have been translated into English for the first time.

Fatimah Busu is an award-winning Malaysian novelist, short-story writer, and academic. Born in 1943 in Kampung Pasir Pekan, Kelantan, she is considered one of the most formidable Malay women writers of her generation. She has authored several award-winning short stories and novels. Fatimah is the recipient of several literary awards including the Kelantan State Laureate in 2015. She rejected the prestigious SEA Write Award as a protest against the violence against Muslim communities in South Thailand.
